- "Imitate me, as I imitate Christ"
- Catechism and Meditation (Temptation)
- Prayer for Revival

God Unfolds His Eternal Purpose (the Glorious Gospel) in Time

- MEDITATE: The Gospel is God's glorious plan for His people.
 - ★ The Gospel is all about God!
- Planned in eternity. (Acts 15:18)
- Unfolded in HISTORY from Creation to the New Jerusalem!
 - **✗** The Gospel is not *only* the life, death, burial, or resurrection of Jesus.
 - ✓ History is about what God is doing with His creation to fulfill His plan!
- God planned that His eternal purpose would be (present tense) accomplished through Christ Jesus our Lord. (Ephesians 3:8-11)
- In the Old Testament, God unfolds His eternal plan in and through Israel.
- God shows who He is and His plans through people, pictures, and types.
 - → Bible Study: Christ in the Old Testament Luke 24:44; John 5:39
- Isaiah 55:8-9

Joseph: A Picture of Christ

- See handout: Joseph: A Picture of Christ
- MEDITATE: Genesis 50:20 with Psalm 105:16-22
- God moved Moses to write down Joseph's life story for our learning. (Romans 15:4) Not to learn from Joseph makes us fools.

Joseph: The Man

- (1) His Family
 - His Father: Jacob, son of Isaac, son of Abraham
 - His Mother: Rachel (Jacob's favorite wife)
 - His brothers and sister (Genesis 29-35)
 - His wife: Asenath (Genesis 41:45)
 - His sons: Manasseh (Genesis 41:50-51), Ephraim (41:52)

(2) His Occupations

- Shepherd (Genesis 37:1-10)
- Slave (Genesis 37:11-36; 39:1-6)
- Prisoner (Genesis 39:7-40:23)
- Second-in-command of Egypt (Genesis 41:1-50:26)

At Seventeen: Responsibility

- His dreams (Genesis 37:5-11)
- The father sends out his favored son, "Go and check on my sons and my flocks." (37:12-17)
 - → Consider the responsibility Jacob gave Joseph at 17 years!
 - → At Shechem (distance >100km) Joseph finds a man who tells him that his brothers moved on to Dothan (distance 20km)
 - → Quit or press forward? At the age of 17 he decides to continue to meet his father's expectation to DO his father's will!

At Seventeen: Sold into Slavery (Genesis 37:18-36)

- Sold to strangers (Ishmaelites/Midianites) for 20 shekels.
- Sold to Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, in Egypt. (v. 36; 39:1)
- ALL AT THE AGE OF 17!

At Seventeen to ~Twenty-Eight: Responsibility (Genesis 39:2-6)

- Despite his circumstances Joseph served at his BEST. (Colossians 3:17, 23)
- He was successful. (vv. 2-3)
 - → See Psalm 1:1-3; Jeremiah 17:7-8; Joshua 1:7-8; 2 Chronicles 31:20-21
- Others could **see** his integrity and character and **trusted** him.
- The LORD was with Joseph. (v. 2)
- The master, Potiphar, <u>saw</u> that the LORD was with Joseph. (Matt 5:16)
- The master gave him more responsibility. (Mattthew 25:21, 23)
 - → It took eleven years for this progression to be realized:
 - ① God prospered Joseph as a simple slave.
 - ② Joseph moved to Potiphar's house.
 - 3 Potiphar notices that God is with Joseph.
 - 4 Potiphar promoted Joseph to his number one position.
 - ⑤ Potiphar's home and fields prospered at the hand of Joseph.
 - © Potiphar gave Joseph full control and responsibility.

- Joseph is a good example of a believer who trusts God and makes the best of his/her difficult circumstances.
- Joseph's hard labor resulted in others being blessed. It seemed the more he
 worked the more others were blessed. God wants us to be a blessing to
 others. (Genesis 12:1-3; Proverbs 22:29)

At Seventeen to ~Twenty-Eight: True Character (Genesis 39:7-11)

- God promises that there is no temptation too great for us. (1 Corinthians 10:13)
- But temptations can and many times be very hard and great. Joseph's temptation is a good example. Christ's example: Matthew 4:1-11
 - ① It was a temptation of the *natural* appetite. Though it was a natural (God-given) appetite it was not right in this case.
 - ② It happened when he was away from home. Business trips, university, vacations, etc.
 - ③ It was made by someone of importance. To please the person would secure his job. To displease her would put his job in jeopardy.
 - ④ It came after an important promotion. Temptation normally follows victory. A way of God reminding us that the power is in HIM not us.
 - (5) It came repeatedly.
 - ⑥ It came at the perfect time no one would know!
- Joseph's fight against temptation:
 - ① (v. 9) "My master trusts me and I will not betray that trust."
 - ★ SIN HURTS OTHERS.
 - ② (v. 9) "How can I sin against God?"
 - All sin is sin against God. (Psalm 51:4)
 - His relationship with God was central to his dealings.
 - Even though this God had allowed sent him to be sold by his brothers and enslaved in Egypt. (Psalm 105:17; Lamentations 3:37-38; Job 1:20-22)
 - ③ (v. 9) He called sin sin! He called sin *great wickedness!*
 - (v. 12) He ran away! (2 Timothy 2:22 contrast with Psalm 1:1-3)
- NOTE: Although Joseph acted in accordance to the will of God he was falsely accused. Consider Christ.

At ~Twenty-Eight: Responsibility (Genesis 39:20-21; 40:1-22)

- Six times in chapter 39 we are told of Joseph's prosperity. (vv. 2, 3, 5, 20, 21, 23)
- Joseph received injustice from the one who he had helped prosper!
 - ★ God receives injustice from us the ones whom He blesses!
- Did Joseph receive injustice from God? (See Colossians 3:23-25; Romans 9:19-20)

Romans 15:4: Have We Learned?

- Adult responsibility and accountability begin much early than our culture has determined. God holds young men (13 years and older) accountable as adults. Parents and children take note!!
- **2** God has a plan for each of us. One must decide to live their life for GOD and not for self and others. (Psalm 139:16; 2 Corinthians 5:15; Galatians 2:20)
 - → Christ came to do the Father's will (John 6:38-40) even unto death. (Philippians 2:5-8)
 - → Whatever we do we are to do for the glory of God! (1 Cor 10:31; Colossians 3:17. 23)
 - → Willfully choose to live God's ways/plan because in the end God's will will be done. (Job 42:2; 23:13; Eccl 3:14; Isaiah 14:27; Proverbs 19:21)
- We are to be STEADFAST, IMMOVABLE, ALWAYS ABOUNDING IN THE WORK OF THE LORD, KNOWING THAT YOUR LABOR IS NOT IN VAIN IN THE LORD no matter the circumstances! (1 Corinthians 15:58)
- We should not expect more responsibility when we cannot be trusted even with little things. (Matthew 25:14ff)
- Trust in the LORD and NOT men! (Proverbs 3:5-7; Psalm 118:8-9; Jeremiah 17:5-7; Micah 7:5-7)
- Expect injustice from the world. BUT remember God's sovereignty and providence. Remember Paul in prison. (1 Peter 4:12, 19; John 15:18-20; Acts 14:22)
- Run away from ALL SIN. Watch and pray so that you do not enter into temptation. (Matthew 26:41; 1 Corinthians 10:13)
- Everything lays naked before God and it is to Him we must give an account. (Hebrews 4:13; Psalm 139:1-16)
- When you are disappointed in men, let that disappointment turn you to the love and faithfulness of God. (2 Timothy 2:13; Proverbs 3:5-6; Psalm 146:3-6; Jeremiah 17:5, 7; Psalm 118:8; 56:3; 115:11)
- **WAIT FOR GOD**. Isaiah 40:30-31; 25:9; **30:18**; Psalm 25:5, 21; 27:14; 37:34; Lamentations 3:25-26; Romans 8:25) All things are appointed by God.
- ★ FINAL LESSON: Our lives belong to God. Surrender and live! Rebel and die!
