A Watchman's Duties (Ezekiel 33:1-11, 30-33; Jer 6:16-17; Isaiah 58:1)

- TO WATCH
 - ① He must first watch himself. (Acts 20:28)
 - → He must be alert. (1 Peter 5:8; 1 Peter 4:7)
 - He must know his responsibility to God and his people.
 - → He must look in two directions:
 - ★ Into the revealed word of God (doctrine).
 - ★ Into the world (practical application of doctrine).
 - 2 He must be awake while others sleep. (1 Thessalonians 5:6)
 - 3 He must fix his attention while others are indifferent.
 - 4 He must look far while others are content with home.
 - ➤ He must have learned from what God did in the past.
 - ➤ He must look at what is happening today. . . And
 - ➤ He must look at the future.

TO WARN

- → Once he sees the danger he must warn.
- → He must warn each and every time. (Jeremiah 6:16-17; Isaiah 58:1; Hosea 8:1; Amos 3:6-8)
- → His warning *must be clear and distinct.* (1 Corinthians 14:8)
- → If he warns, he has done his job and is innocent. (Acts 20:26-31)
- → If he does not warn, he is quilty. (Ezekiel 33:6)

REASONS WHY A WATCHMAN WOULD NOT WARN

- ① He is asleep on the wall.
- ② He is in darkness himself and unable to see.
- ③ He is proud and believes that the threat is not dangerous.
- 4 He does not want to frighten the people.
- (5) He does not want to be called a fanatic.

The People's Duties

- Heed the warning of the watchman. (Hebrews 13:17; 2:1)
- · Warn others.

Reactions to Watchmen's Warnings in the Past (Ezek 33:30-33;

Jeremiah 6:16-17)

- They heard but did not do. (v. 31)
- They talked about the watchman and not the message. (v. 30)
- They came to be entertained and not warned. (v. 32)
- They didn't want to hear about God's hatred of their sins. (Isa. 30:8-11)
- They did not believe that God will do what He said He would do. (Jer 5:12-13)
- They wanted their ears tickled. (Jeremiah 5:30-31; 2 Timothy 4:3-4)
- They wanted the prophet to approve their sins. (Micah 2:11)
- They wanted to hear **new** things. (Acts 17:21)
- They wanted to kill (words and stones) those that spoke against them. (Luke 20:19; 11:47, 49; Jeremiah 26:8; 18:8; 20:1-2; Matthew 23:34,37)
- They wanted the watchman to stop blowing the trumpet. (Isaiah 30:8-11)

Eternal Purpose of God

God's Calendar

- God's seven feasts (Hebrew: moed) "appointed times".
- God's feast: God is the Host
- God sharing His joy with His guests His special people.
 - ★ Christ is God's greatest joy: Matthew 3:17; 17:5.
 - ★ ALL feasts point to Christ. (Luke 24:6-7, 44; John 5:39)
- Where are we on God's calendar: "time of the Gentiles" Luke 21:24; Romans 11:25. This time has an appointed end.
 - ★ THEREFORE, TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE . . . (Heb 3:7-8, 15)
- Feast of Trumpets
 - ➤ Marked by last New Moon on the Lunar Calendar
 - ➤ Comes after a long time of no feasts! Consider Matthew 25:5; 25:14-15.
 - ➤ End of "Harvest" (Luke 10:2; 21:24)
 - ➤ An ingathering of the Harvest (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)
 - ➤ Beginning of great celebration (Psalm 16:11; 36:8)
- Warning: Jeremiah 8:20

The Shadow: Lev 23:23-25; Num 29:1-6; Col 2:16-17; 1 Thess 4:13-15

- Holy Assembly. All males required! (Exodus 23:14-17; 34:22; Deut 16:16)
- No Work
- Blowing of Trumpets (Psalm 81:1-3; Numbers 10:1-10)
- · A shadow has no power.
- A shadow is not the Substance. (Colossians 2:16-17)
- A picture is not the Real Thing.
- The Substance: Something BETTER the return of Christ for His Church

- Who Is He Coming for? Is He Coming for You? (Isaiah 25:9; Luke
 - 12:35-48; Heb 9:28; Romans 8:23-25; Philip 3:20-21; Titus 2:11-14; Luke 12:35-43; 14:26-33; 2 Tim 4:8; 2 Peter 3:12-14)
 - 43, 14.20-33, 2 11111 4.0, 2 Peter 3.12-14)

Those Who Are Ready - Are You Ready? (Luke 12:35-37)

- → 1 Peter 1:13-15 Are you pursuing holiness? (Hebrews 12:14)
- → Are you DRESSED? (2 Peter 3:1-14; Matthew 22:1-14; Isaiah 61:10)
- Parable of Ten Virgins (Matthew 25:1-13) MEDITATE on similarities!!
- When you least expect it. (Luke 12:40) Are you expecting it tonight?
- Like a thief in the night (Mark 13:33-37; Revelation 3:3; 16:15; Matthew 24:43;
 - 1 Thess 5:2-3; 2 Peter 3:10)
 - ① He comes int the darkest part of the night.
 - ② He comes quietly and unobserved by sleepers.
 - ③ He comes to snatch something.
 - 4 He comes for His "jewels". He comes for what is rightly HIS.
 - ★ Pearl of Great Price (Matthew 13:45-46; Malachi 3:16-18; 1 Peter 2:9; Titus 2:14)
 - ★ (KJV) God's *peculiar* people! (Titus 2:14; 1 Peter 2:9)
 - belonging exclusively to one person (1 Corinthians 6:19-20; 1 Peter 2:9)
 - ② distinctive/only one (Romans 12:4-5)
 - different from the usual or normal (Ephesians 1:4; 1 Peter 1:13-16)
 - Legally: something exempt from the ordinary jurisdiction of whose territory it lies. (Hebrew 11:13-16; 1 Peter 2:11; John 17:14, 16; 15:18-19)
 - ⑤ He is not interested in things of no value unprofitable. (Romans 3:12; Matthew 5:13; 25:30; Psalm 14:1-3; 53:1-3)
 - **6** He comes and goes before others are aware.
 - $\ensuremath{{\mathbb C}}$ He leaves the house greatly impoverished but Himself greatly enriched.

Those Who Are Watching - Are You Watching (Luke 12:37)

- Are you carefully watching? (Luke 12:37)
- Are you eagerly watching? (Hebrews 9:28)
- Are you watching and being sober?. (1 Thessalonians 5:6)

Those Who Are Working - Are You Working?

- A faith without works will not save! (James 2:14-26)
- Those who hear and do not do are deceiving themselves. (James 1:22)
- Luke 12:43 Christ is coming back for those who are BUSY doing His will.
 (Matthew 7:21; 1 John 2:17)
- Ephesians 2:10; Titus 2:14 Are you zealous for good works?

Those Who Love/Obey Him (Hebrews 5:9; John 14:15, 21, 23-24)

- He is NOT coming for those who do not love Him and His Word.
- Those who do not love Christ are ACCURSED. (1 Corinthians 16:22)
- He is not coming for those who make EXCUSES.(Luke 14:16-24)

Those Who Are Groaning - Are You Groaning? (Romans 8:22-25)

- "groan" PRESENT TENSE something we are always doing.
- "groan" "sigh, murmur, pray inaudibly"

Those Who Must Give an Account

• (Matthew 25:14-30, 34-46; 2 Cor 5:8-10; Eccl12:13-14; Romans 2:6-10; John 5:26-29; Jeremiah 17:10; Gal 6:7-8; Rev 2:23; 22:12; **Hebrews 4:13**)

What Do Christians Do to Be Ready?

- Listening to and submitting to their "watchmen/overseers". (Hebrews 13:17; James 1:22; Jeremiah 25:4)
- Watch and Pray Always (Luke 21:36; 1 Thessalonians 5:6; 1 Peter 4:7)
 - → Serious watching
- → Serious prayer
- → Groaning for the day
- → Watching for the REAL BETTER THING PERSON!
- Zealous for Good Works (Titus 2:14)
 - → Busy about the works that God foreordained for us to live in. (Ephesians 2:10; 1 Corinthians 15:58)
 - → He is not coming for the complacent/lazy. (Zephaniah 1:12)
 - → He is not coming for those who make excuses. (Luke 14:18)
 - → A faith without works is not a faith that will save you.
 - ★ A working faith saves. (James 2:14-26)
- Watching with perseverance. (Romans 8:25; 2:7; Hebrews 3:14; 6:11-12; Matthew 10:22; 24:13; Mark 13:13)
 - ★ It is not EASY being a Christian.
 - ★ It takes DESIRE and DETERMINATION, DISCIPLINE, DILIGENCE, DELIGHT, and DOING God's commandments/will.
- ➤ Pursue holiness (1 Peter 1:13-16; 3:14; Heb 12:14; Rev 3:18; 2 Cor 13:5)
 - ★ Examine ourselves, confess and repent of all sins to be found "without spot and blameless" when He comes.
