Penitential Psalms

- Psalm 6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 143
- "penitence" "feeling or showing sorrow and regret for have done wrong; repentance of sins".

Blessed Are the Forgiven (Psalm 32:1-2)

- \star "Blessed" is in the plural this person is *abundantly* blessed by God.
- ★ God's *readiness* to forgive.

What Is Repentance? -

- ONLY those who continually REPENT of their sins go to heaven. (Luke 13:1-5)
- Repentance is EMPHASIZED in the Gospel of the New Testament.
- Repentance is a forsaking sin (lawlessness) and turning to obedience to the *written* Word of God. Anything less is NOT REPENTANCE.

REMINDER: David's sin was presumptuous! According to the LAW there was no atonement for deliberate/presumptuous sins! (Number 15:30-31) - meditate on the "because" in verse 31.

HENCE: Psalm 51:16 - "For You do not desire/want/delight in sacrifice, or else I would give it; You do not delight in burnt offering."

Have Mercy Upon Me, O God (Psalm 51:1)

- THE ONLY HOPE FOR A PRESUMPTUOUS SINNER IS GOD'S MERCY!
- MERCY IS NOT FREE!
- God bestowing mercy on sinners is NOTHING like a human judge bestowing mercy on a criminal.

- God bestows His mercy on whom He wishes and withholds His mercy on whomever He wishes. (Romans 9:18)
- God's JUSTICE must FIRST be satisfied before He can bestow His mercy.
- (Luke 18:9-14) The Pharisee and the Tax Collector. "God, **be merciful** to me **the** sinner."

According to Your Abundance . . . (Psalm 51:1)

The "WORK" of FORGIVENESS (Psalm 51:1-12)

- ► (v. 1) BLOT OUT. (Isaiah 43:25)
- ► (v. 2) WASH ME THOROUGHLY. (1 Corinthians 6:9-11)
- ► (v. 2) CLEANSE ME. (See Psalm 19:12)

I ACKNOWLEDGE MY TRANSGRESSIONS (REBELLION), AND MY SIN IS ALWAYS BEFORE ME.

(v. 3)

AGAINST YOU, YOU ONLY, HAVE I SINNED, AND DONE EVIL IN YOUR SIGHT.

(v. 4)

- ► (v. 7) PURGE ME.
- ► (v. 8) MAKE ME HEAR JOY and GLADNESS.
- ► (v. 9) HIDE YOUR FACE from MY SINS.
- ► (v. 9) BLOT OUT ALL MY INIQUITIES.
- ► (v. 10) CREATE in ME a CLEAN HEART (mind, will, emotions).
- ► (v. 10) RENEW in ME a STEADFAST SPIRIT.
- ► (v. 11) DO NOT CAST ME FROM YOUR PRESENCE.
- (v. 11) DO NOT TAKE YOUR HOLY SPIRIT FROM ME. (See 1 Thess 5:19; Ephesians 4:30; 5:18; Galatians 5:16)
- ► (v. 12) RESTORE TO ME THE JOY OF YOUR SALVATION.
- (v. 12) UPHOLD ME by YOUR GENEROUS SPIRIT. (Psalm 17:5; 19:13; 119:116-117, 133)

The ONLY Sacrifice for Presumptuous Sin (Psalm 51:16-17)

- ★ MARK WELL: This and this alone is what God accepts! MEDITATE!
- ★ God <u>delights</u> in nothing else!
- ★ There is NOTHING we can give/do to appease God when we sin against Him.
 - ① A BROKEN SPIRIT Matthew 5:5; Luke 18:11-14
 - ➤ This is BROKENNESS over our sins. It is agreement with God how bad our sins are!

- As long as we justify ourselves, excuse ourselves, making small issue of our many sins, comparing ourselves to others our sins we will NEVER be reconciled to God!
- Using the excuse, "It's okay! Jesus died for all my sins anyway! God has already forgiven me!"
- **② A BROKEN and CONTRITE HEART**
 - Psalm 34:18; Isaiah 57:15; Isaiah 66:1-3; 66:2; Ezek 9:3-4, 6.
 - A contrite heart/spirit is one that is "crushed, crippled". A contrite heart is one that <u>feels</u> the crushing weight of guilt and the depth of depravity, and at the same time accepts the righteous condemnation of sin. (Psalm 51:3-4)
 - A contrite heart/spirit gives no excuses and does not blame others.
- ★ Broken and contrite heart is one that grieves in *sinning against God!* (Psalm 51:4)
- ★ Only throwing ourselves on the mercy of God will He be pleased!
- ★ GOD LOOKS AT THE HEART! (1 Samuel 16:7) NOT OUR WORDS! NOT OUR RELIGIOUS ACTIVITY!
- ★ NOTE: Though the disciple has be forgiven for ALL his sins genuine biblical repentance is still NECESSARY!
- ★ NOTE: The FIRST beatitude in Christ's sermon on the mount is, "Blessed are the poor is spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:3)
 - "poor in spirit" "To be 'poor in spirit' is to realize that I have nothing, am nothing, and can do nothing, and have need of all things." (AWP) (Isaiah 40:17; Psalm 62:9; Daniel 4:34-35; 2 Corinthians 12:11; Ephesians 3:8; 1 Corinthians 15:8-10; Luke 17:10)
 - God created man to be TOTALLY DEPENDED on Him!

The RESPONSE of One Who Has Been Forgiven (Psalm 51:14-15)

- (v. 14) David continues to cry out to "God" (not LORD). He acknowledges his great guilt!
 - ► He knows that ONLY GOD can save him from his guilt!
- (vv. 14-15) The REASONABLE response to God's forgiveness is to SING ALOUD of God's righteousness! LOUD PRAISE!
