USING DISCIPLE SKILLS

Psalm 23

- (v. 4) "Yea, though I walk . . ." (Read 1st verses 1-3)
 - "to walk" ("to live") signifies . . .
 - ① ACTION something we do possibly and actively.
 - ② VOLUNTARY ACT God holds us accountable for our walk (how we live) in this world.
 - **③ DIRECTION**
 - ★ Either we are going forward or we are going backwards. Jeremiah 7:24, 26; 32:33) Meditate on Hebrews 2:1.
 - Either one walks according to the ways of the world (which is under the influence/sway of the devil that leads to death - 1 John 5:19; Ephesians 2:1-3; Matthew 7:13) OR he walks in the



- ways of God that leads to life. (Matthew 7:14)
- Since the FUTURE is UNCERTAIN and we are in a wilderness we NEED a Guide. (Psalm 119:105; Proverbs 6:23.
 - → (John 16:13) God sent His Spirit to lead us into TRUTH. (See Isaiah 30:21)
 - → God's path is marked out by His commandments. (Psalm 119:35)
 - → A disciple avoids WRONG/DANGEROUS/EVIL paths. (Psalm 1:1-3; Proverbs 4:14-15)

- ④ MANNER of walking.
 - Our walk must be worthy of the LORD! We are to walk BLAMELESS. (Genesis 17:1; Ephesians 5:15-17; Proverbs 4:25-27; 1 John 2:6; Joshua 1:7; Colossians 1:9-11)
- 5 A GOAL
 - Paul says he presses forward to the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 3:12-14)
 - Our first goal for 2025 is to pursue PERFECTION. (Philippians 3:12-14; Matthew 5:48; Ephesians 4:13)



- (Hebrews 11:13-16) The "Father's Land" is our goal.
- ⑥ STEADY PROGRESS. With every step we should be progressing toward our goal.
 - Disciples GROW and MATURE in <u>the</u> faith. (Ephesians 4:11-16; 1 Corinthians 14:20; Hebrews 5:12-14; 1 Peter 2:1-2)
 - ★ The disciple knows his road, knows its end, and is resolved to follow the path and feels safe even when obstacles present themselves.
 - ★ (Hebrews 12:1) The disciple runs "the race set" before him by God daily. He runs with <u>endurance</u>.
 - → "endurance" In the NT, this Greek word signifies steadfastness, constancy. It describe the characteristic of a man who is not swerved from his <u>deliberate purpose</u> and his <u>loyalty</u> to faith and piety by even the <u>greatest</u> trials and sufferings. He never gives up but perseveres to the end. (Matt 10:22; 24:13; Romans 2:7; Hebrews 3:6, 14; 6:11; James 1:12)



"The Valley of the Shadow of Death" (v. 4)

- NOTE: The Shepherd, leading them in paths of righteousness, leads to a very dark valley!
- EXAMPLES:

- ★ EXAMPLE: Reign of King Hezekiah 2 Chronicles 29-32
- ★ EXAMPLE: Paul 2 Corinthians 11:23-30; 12:9-10; Ephesians 3:1, 13; 4:1
- ★ EXAMPLE: Job Chapters 1 & 2
- ★ EXAMPLE: Christ 1 Peter 2:21; Psalm 22
- ★ EXAMPLE: Church of Smyrna Revelation 2:8-11
- ★ See 1 Peter 1:3-9; 3:14; 4:16-17; James 1:2-3.
- The phrase comes up in Psalm 44:19; 107:10, 14; Job 3:5; 10:21-22; 24:17; 16:16; 38:17; Isaiah 9:2; Jeremiah 2:6; 13:16; Matthew 4:16; Amos 5:8; Luke 1:79. (19 times)
- The NIV, NLT, NET and HCSB translate this phrase "the darkest valley".
- The Hebrews word literally used is defined: "shade of death the grave (figuratively calamity)"
- The phrase is used to convey a perilously threatening environment.
- The disciple . . .
 - ➤ He is NOT walking in, BUT through! He is going forward NOT backwards.(Jeremiah 7:24, 26; 32:33; Isaiah 1:4; Hebrews 2:1)

➤ HE WHO DOES NOT FOLLOW (OBEY) THE SHEPHERD WILL GO BACKWARDS!

We <u>must</u> give the <u>more earnest heed</u> to the things we have heard, lest <u>we drift</u> away. Hebrews 2:1



- The psalmist/disciple is walking confidently and NOT in fear as his Shepherd leads him into "the valley of the shadow of death."
- He does not describe his trials (even, DEATH) as "the valley of death", BUT "the shadow of the valley of death".
 - → For there to be a shadow there must be LIGHT!
 - → No one is afraid of a shadow. A shadow cannot stop or hinder a pilgrim on his journey.
 - → For the disciple, DEATH itself has been swallowed up and therefore cannot hurt us. (John 8:51-52; Romans 8:36-38; 1 Corinthians 15:54-56; 2 Corinthians 1:9-10; 2 Timothy 1:10; Hebrews 2:14)

- ★ Here on Earth, God's people are walking through "the valley of the shadow of death" - see Ephesians 2:1 with Ezekiel 37)
- God's valleys WORK FOR US! (Romans 5:1-5; 2 Corinthians 4:17-18; Psalm 119:67; 119:71; Matthew 5:11-12)
- The disciple keeps his eyes on his Shepherd the AUTHOR and FINISHER of his faith. (Hebrews 12:2; Philippians 1:6; 1 Peter 5:10; 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24; Romans 8:28-30)
- Consider Romans 8:18.

The Pilgrims Goal (Hebrews 11:10, 13-16; Psalm 23:6)

- (v. 6) The psalmist speaks confidently, "I WILL dwell in the house of the LORD forever!"
- (Hebrews 11:13-16)
 - ➤ (v. 13) Disciples live on promises NOT circumstances! Their TRUST is in their Shepherd and HIS Word.
 - (vv. 13-14) Disciples confess that this "valley" though very dark is not their home. They walk on the path that leads to LIFE (Matthew 7:13-14). They CONTINUALLY SEEK (intensively -PRESENT TENSE; ACTIVE VOICE) a homeland. (Literally, a father-land — a place where their Father is - HOME!) (Isaiah 26:3-4; Colossians 3:1-3; Psalm 16:11; 73:25-26)

► (v. 16) GOD HAS PREPARED A PLACE FOR THEM!

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
